<p>The <i>Aboriginal Protection and Restriction of the Sale of Opium Act</i> (Qld) allows the Chief Protector to remove local Aboriginal people onto and between reserves and hold children in dormitories. <p>Australia becomes a Federation. The Constitution states that Aboriginal People will not be counted in the census, and the Commonwealth has the power to make laws relating to any race of people in Australia with the exception of Aborigines. The federated states therefore retain exclusive power over Aboriginal affairs until the Constitution is amended in 1967.</p>
